the pupal skin splits, the
adult insect climbs out, and

For a year, while others have a single generation, and a few in cold locations may take several years to pass through their whole life cycle. Some butterflies have parasitoidal relationships with organisms including protozoans, flies, ants, and other invertebrates, and are predated by vertebrates.
